INDIA TEMPLE ASSOCIATION / BERLIN TEMPLE

- Balvihar is part of India Temple Association, (ITA) a 501(3) (c) member-based non-profit with a broad religious, cultural and social mission.
- We have a Temple in Berlin, NJ which is open daily. Aarti is performed twice daily. (Noon & 8pm). There is a pujari on staff who conducts puja services at the Temple and in the community.
- Our YouTube channel broadcasts daily Aarti and religious events occurring at the Temple.
- ITA celebrates most Hindu festivals and religious events. Event details can be found in our monthly newsletter, Satsang Sandesh. We also organize special events just for Children such as Navratri, Vasant Panchami, Diwali, Janmashtami, and Holi.
- Our Pujari performs puja for all important life occasions
- We have a community service group that fund raises and does community service projects and a program for senior citizens that meets weekly.
- We are 100% run by volunteers except for employed Pujari.

HISTORY OF BALVIHAR (DECADES IN THE MAKING)

- Started in the late 70's in a Founders Basement
- Moved to Berlin Temple when it was purchased in early 80's
- Moved to the Marlton Schools in 2010
- Last year we had:
 - 375 Students
 - 35 High School Student Leaders
 - 48 Teachers
 - 15+ Operations and Admin Volunteers
- We are 100% Volunteer Run – Many of us are 2nd Generation!

- 10 Year Program from Pre-K to 8th
- Designed to build a steady increasing base of knowledge, understanding and appreciation
- 16-18 sessions per year on Sunday mornings
- Year End Annual Day Show – **FOR COMMITTED & INTERESTED**
- Optional Shloka Classes offered pre-session
- Domino's pizza for lunch

TEACHING MODEL & CLASS STRUCTURE

- Classes organized by school grade
- Two Adult Teachers per class for Pre-K to 6th Grade for Core Classes
- Three Teacher Team for 7th & 8th grades with each teacher focused on area of expertise
- Separate Conversational Hindi and Yoga Teaching Teams
- One or two High School Student Volunteer(s) that are Balvihar graduates
- Class size: 15-20 students (2026 Expected Average 16)
- 150+ YouTube “Topic of the Day (TOD)” videos to support in class learning. TOD Videos are short ~5 minute videos created by our high school Student Leaders. 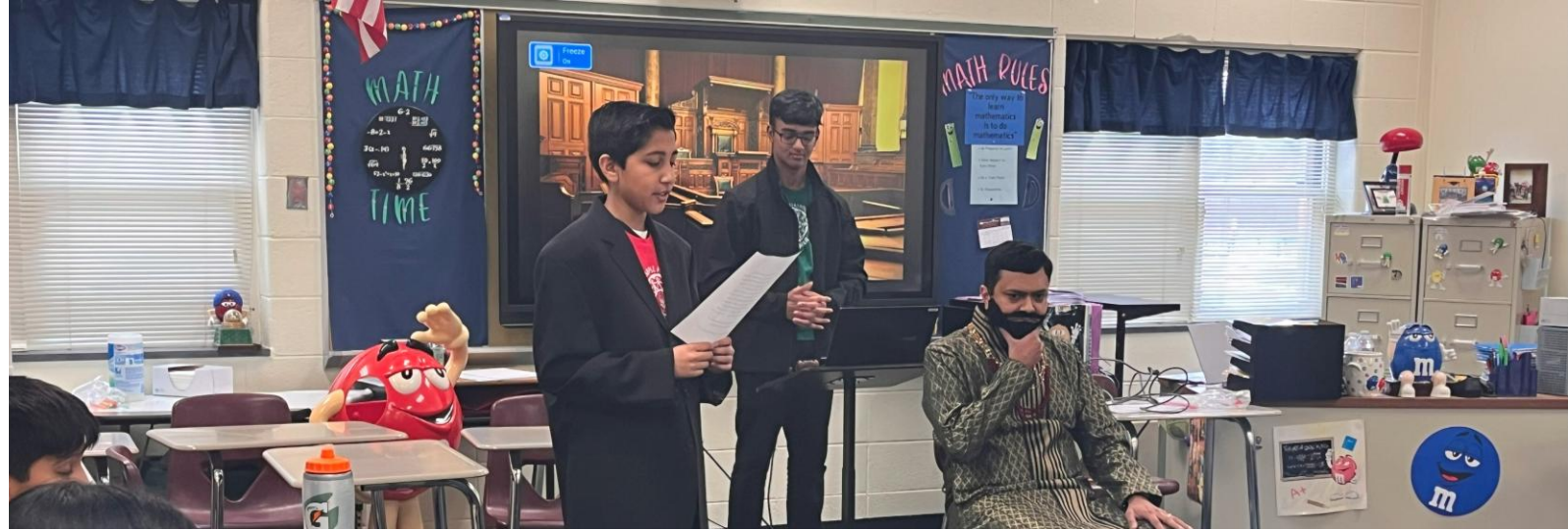

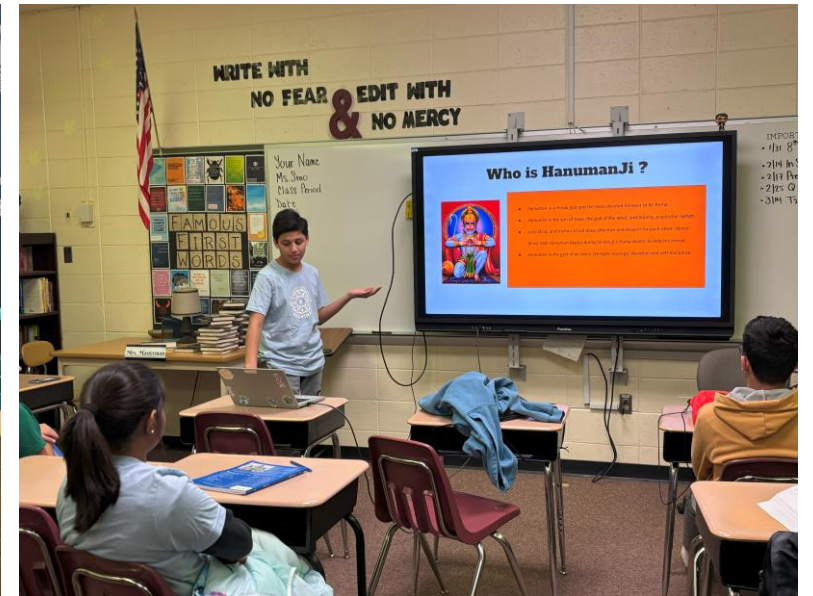

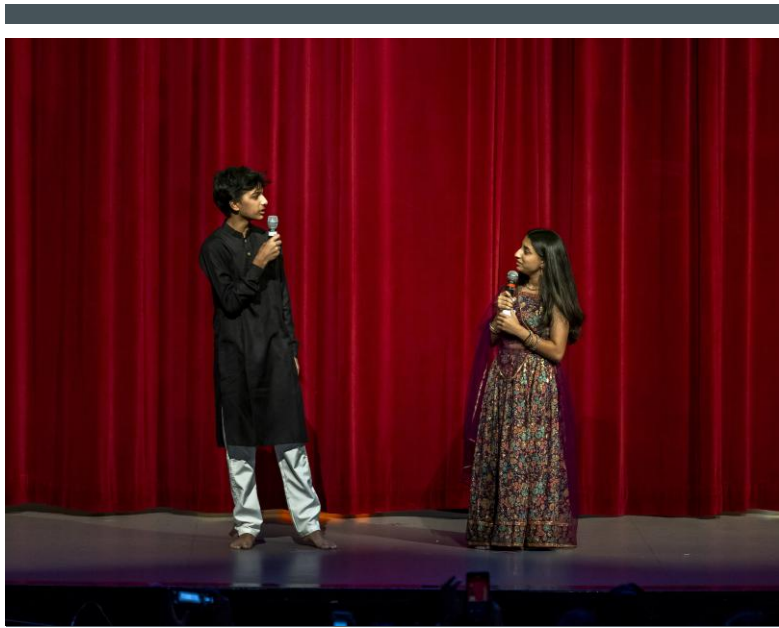


MAKING BALVIHAR A POSITIVE EXPERIENCE

DROP OFF / PICK UP

Marlton Police will be overseeing drop off and pick up.

Arrival / Dropoff:

---You may use the car lane to drop off children that do not require assistance to exit the car. Parents must stay in car if using car lane. If your child requires assistance, please park and walk them to the entrance using designated cross walk.

Dismissal / Pick-up:

---You must park and walk to the entrance to meet your child. We will not release your child until you are in the entrance area.

---We ask that you arrive at least 5 minutes before your child's dismissal time. If you have multiple children, you must arrive at your youngest child's dismissal time.

---PreK to 2nd grades will be escorted out.

---Please stand at the front of the dismissal area when your child's grade is announced. This will allow staff to more quickly identify you and match you to your child.

IMPORTANT LOGISTICS: DRESS CODE / APPROPRIATE CLOTHING

Required Dress Code

- Students are expected to wear their Balvihar T-Shirts during each session of Balvihar. It helps us both track students and builds cohesion among students. Students who repeatedly violate this rule will not be admitted into class.

Please dress your children in clothing that is appropriate for a religious program.

- Pre-K to 3rd grade students will be performing yoga. Please have them wear athletic pants.
- Grades 4th to 8th students can wear shorts or skirts, but they must be knee length.

IMPORTANT LOGISTICS: DROP OFF

Morning Drop Off

- Except Pre-K parents, no other parents will be allowed in the building at anytime. This is to help us maintain a secure environment.
- Doors will open for Optional Shloka session students at 9:25am. Only students participating in these classes will be permitted inside the school. Please note Shloka Classes begin with Session 2nd Balvihar session
- Doors will open for regular BV session at 9:45 am. Students will not be permitted inside before this time. Early drops offs are not permitted; parents must stay with their children until doors are opened.
- Children arriving after 10:00am will be considered late and will be asked to wait in cafeteria until the completion of morning shlokas at appx 10:10am. Children arriving after 10:30am will be marked late and will be ineligible for perfect attendance award.

IMPORTANT LOGISTICS: DROP OFF

Morning Drop Off

- Following rules must be adhered to if you are using the car line to drop off your child:
 - Parents must remain in the car at all times while in drop-off car line; if your child requires assistance to exit the car, then DO NOT use the car line. Park your car and walk your child to the entrance.
 - Drive extremely slowly in drop off-line and be vigilant at all times.
 - A Marlton Police Officer and Volunteers will be outside during drop off to enforce these rules.
- If you park and are walking your child to the entrance, please ensure they are crossing at designated crosswalk areas to ensure their safety. For our little young students, we strongly encourage you hold their hands.
- We ask that you do not approach Volunteers with questions or issues during Drop Off. You can speak with them after drop off is completed (~10am). We want the volunteers focused on safety of kids and traffic!

IMPORTANT LOGISTICS: PICK UP

Early Dismissal Procedures:

- Early dismissal will ONLY be accommodated between 10:30am-11:45am. This time is FIRM.
- If you arrive after 11:45am, **you will have to wait until your child's normal dismissal time**; please plan ahead.
- Children Leaving early will be marked as having missed part of session and will be ineligible for perfect attendance award.
- You DO NOT need to inform us ahead of time that your child will be leaving early.
- Following rules must be adhered for early pick up:
 - Arrive at main entrance and wait for member of Volunteer staff
 - Provide your child's first and last name and their specific class (e.g. Vaayu A vs Vaayu B)
 - Notification will be received by our Volunteer staff inside and your child will be retrieved; please be patient.
 - Students can not leave on their own. They have to wait until member of Volunteer staff arrives to pull them out of class and escorts them to main entrance.

IMPORTANT LOGISTICS: DISMISSAL / PICK UP

Regular Dismissal Procedure:

- Dismissal is staggered to allow quicker pairing of students and parents.
- Pre-K to 3rd grade children will be escorted out at their stated dismissal time.
- 4th – 8th grade will be allowed to exit at their stated dismissal time
- This we plan to trial letting 8th graders leave the blocked area at dismissal.
- You must arrive at your youngest child's dismissal time. Do not tell your child to wait inside for an older sibling! We don't have space.
- If you want your child to skip lunch, instruct them to go straight to front door after Arati and let the posted volunteer know. You MUST BE present to pick them up when they come out. If you are not present, your child will be sent to the cafeteria, and you will need to wait until 1pm. In addition, if your child does not follow your instructions, you will have to wait until 1pm because we do not have enough volunteers to search for your child in the crowded cafeteria. No exceptions.

IMPORTANT LOGISTICS: DISMISSAL / PICK UP

Regular Dismissal Procedure (Cont.):

- There is no car line for Pick up. You must park your car in the parking lot and walk to the front of the building to pick up your child. Driver way will be CLOSED during pick up.
- Please pay attention as your students are exiting the school and ensure you walk up towards entrance so Volunteer and your child can easily identify you.
- A Marlton Police Officer and Volunteers will be outside during dismissal times to ensure order and safety at all times.
- LATENESS WILL NOT BE TOLERATED
 - It is critical for parents to arrive on time; being late is inconsiderate and makes it hard for us to complete tasks needed to turn the school over to the maintenance staff. This jeopardizes our ability to continue to use the school.
 - Late parents also create a disruptive domino effect that makes the situation less safe and delays dismissal for everyone.
- Please do not approach Volunteer staff during dismissal with questions or issues. Distracting us from matching children to their parents can cause a significant safety issue. You can approach us after dismissal concludes or via email/phone during the week.

Parent Availability

One parent should be reachable on the numbers provided on the enrollment form and be able to return quickly to Balvihar in case of emergency.

Security

Under normal circumstances, only the Marlton Middle School entrance located in front of the main parking lot should be used for entrance and exit. In case of an emergency, all of the school's exits can be used for egress. The program has hired Evesham Township Police to serve as on-site security at every Balvihar session from 9:15 am to 1:15 pm. When Annual Day practice sessions begin, hours of Police presence will be expanded or adjusted accordingly. All Parents and Children should feel empowered to approach the Officer present with any safety concerns or issues.

Unique Circumstances

If there is a special situation that exists that is transient or permanent that requires an accommodation, please reach out to us. We try to be flexible when possible.

Keeping Balvihar Safe

We want Balvihar to be a safe and healthy environment for our children to learn and grow. Prohibited Substances & Items

Alcohol, drugs, or other substances that can be used to cause a condition of intoxication, inebriation, excitement, or stupefaction are prohibited at any Balvihar event. New Jersey law expressly prohibits weapons at schools. As such, there are serious penalties for possessing a weapon of any kind, including firearms, knives, stun guns, tear gas, BB guns, and imitation firearms, on school grounds. Parents and students should be vigilant. If anyone becomes aware of or suspects the presence of any of these banned items on premises or that a student or Volunteer is under the influence of any substance, please notify the Balvihar Administrative team and/or the police officer on duty immediately. Any Student caught with possession of any prohibited substance or item will be expelled from Balvihar.

ADDITIONAL POLICIES & PROCEDURES

Code of Conduct, Cell Phones & Toys

Balvihar is an educational program. We need to maintain a positive, supportive environment. Each family has agreed to a code of conduct as part of the enrollment process. Except in the case of emergency, students are prohibited from using cell phones at all times while Balvihar is in session. Repeated violation of this rule may result in your child not being admitted into Balvihar. Children are not allowed to play with toys during class. Please familiarize your child with the rules and the need to report anything that would result in the positive environment being compromised.

Food, Beverages or Water bottles

No food and beverages of any kind including water are allowed in any part of the school except the cafeteria. The school does have water fountains which students are permitted to use. Violation of these rules can result in loss of the school for Balvihar. We ask that you please ensure your child has eaten a good breakfast prior to arriving.

Sickness Guidelines for Parents

Parents are asked not to bring their child to Balvihar if their child is unwell. This includes but is not limited to cold/flu-like symptoms, fever, vomiting, diarrhea, severe cough, colored nasal drainage, pink eye, lice, open skin lesions or any infectious disease. If a child shows any signs of sickness during Balvihar, we will contact you to pick your child up.

GRADUATION, STUDENT LEADER PROGRAM & YOUTH COMMUNITY SERVICE GROUP REQUIREMENTS

8TH GRADE GRADUATION REQUIREMENT

In order to graduate from the Balvihar Program a student must have greater than 75% attendance and receive a passing grade on the final exam during their final year (8th grade).

STUDENT LEADER PROGRAM (for 8th grade students only)

Student Leaders (SL) return to Balvihar to teach and serve as role models. Their responsibilities escalate over time as they demonstrate commitment and competence in delivering the Balvihar curriculum. SLs commit to be at Balvihar every session and are willing to do preparatory work between sessions. Participants typically earn 80-100 community service hours. In order to be eligible to apply to the Student Leader program, graduating 8th graders must have 85% attendance (missing two sessions, being late or leaving early less than 4 times or some combination) or better; the recommendation from the 8th grade teachers indicating that the student has a demonstrated interest in the Balvihar and a passing score on the 8th grade test. We are looking for students that have affinity for teaching and our curriculum. The eligible students submit an application which includes a lesson from our program. We select ~8 students based on availability and application quality.

YOUTH COMMUNITY SERVICE GROUP (for 8th grade students only)

Youth Community Service Group is in its second year. YCSG volunteers help at ITA and other community services events. Students must commit to performing at least 35 hours of community service and helping at 12 events to be in YCSG. This program requires a lower level of commitment than the Student Leader Program and offers greater degree of flexibility in terms which events they choose to volunteer at. However, participants in this program need to be able to volunteer on weekdays and weekends as well as volunteer at approximately one event per month. In order to be eligible to apply to the Youth Community Service Group, graduating 8th grader must have 75% attendance (missing four sessions, being late or leaving early less than 8 times or some combination) or better; a recommendation from the 8th grade teachers indicating that they have a demonstrated interest in our culture; and a passing score on the 8th grade test. We select 5-6 graduates for this program each year.

WE NEED MORE COOPERATION FROM PARENTS

RECOGNIZE

- This program is run by volunteers.
- We all have families and busy professional careers.
- We do this as a service to make the world and our community better.

PLEASE BE:

- **RESPECTFUL:** Volunteers spending 100's of hours don't deserve to be mistreated.
- **TIMELY:** Late students disrupt the learning experience.
- **ATTENTIVE:** Read our emails!
- **ENGAGED:** Talk to your children about their lesson and make sure they are staying on track
- **PATIENT:** We make mistakes, and we can't always fix them immediately.
- **FOLLOW RULES:** With over 750 parents and students, even a small number of people asking for special treatment creates a great deal of work and burden.

REMEMBER

- You agreed to a code of conduct in when you enrolled your children. Individuals or families that violate the code will be asked to leave the program.

REQUEST FOR CONSIDERATION

Examples of Parent behavior when multiplied makes it difficult for us:

- Being late to pick up your child
- Ignoring teacher emails
- Emailing or texting for information that has been already distributed
- Failing to pick up materials on time
- Blocking the driveway at drop off
- Asking us to physically mail your child's program materials
- Registering late and calling to get a discount
- Asking for special treatment because of your profession
- Signing up your child for Annual Day, but failing to attend practices, complaining about practice times that were disclosed at sign-up or dropping out last minute
- Forgetting to sign up for Annual Day and asking for your child to be added last minute
- Telling us your child is sick and will miss Annual Day practice when they are instead at a birthday party
