Karma and Reincarnation

In modern times, the common axioms "Every action has an equal but opposite reaction" and "What goes around comes around" have been used in media and conversation to portray the concept of karma, one of Hinduism's many jewels of wisdom. Although both of these sayings accurately represent the general idea of karma, the implications are much deeper and more complex. The belief, which broadly describes the principle of cause and effect, is universal and governs all life. The word karma means act, and karma is the sum of all of one's actions and thoughts. It states that every physical, mental, and emotional act, no matter how small, is recorded as an impression onto one's soul and will eventually return in the form of their future. Such reactions are not necessarily immediate and are the cumulative effect of the previous thoughts and actions of the person (sanchita karma). Simply put, if one provides love and happiness, one will experience equal happiness, but if one causes suffering, one will experience the same suffering.

In recent times, the principle of karma has been prone to many misconceptions due to its depiction in a negative light by forms of media such as songs and movies. Karma is not about punishment or revenge, but in fact about fairness. Everything and everyone is subject to it. Many people think that one's karma is pre-decided, but this is unreasonable. According to The Aetherius Society, everyone has the power to change their karma (agami karma), as it is dependent on their own thoughts and actions; positive actions can destroy negative karma and create positive karma. The importance of service in Hinduism is illustrated by this same concept. As one provides for others, he/she will eventually be rewarded by his/her positive karma in some way, possibly wealth. This reward will provide them a greater opportunity to help others and provide love, happiness, and health. This continual cycle, which results in the greater good of humanity, is essence of karma.

However, with the belief of the karma theory, it would only make sense for reincarnation to follow. When a person dies, he/she would not have fulfilled all of their karma, meaning that he/she would not have received experiences equal to what they had given. Thus, they must be reincarnated and continue the cycle. For this reason, death is simply the death of one's physical body; their life continues, since their soul (atma) is still alive. While waiting to be reincarnated, this atma lives on in an astral body in a different physical realm, one which has a different frequency than the one we live in. In conversation, those with higher frequencies are considered to be forms of "heaven," and those with lower frequencies are considered to be forms of "hell." In these realms, the soul continues to experience emotions as well as relationships, those which reflect the unfulfilled karma of the soul at the time of the body's death. Once the soul has evolved spiritually, it is ready to enter a new physical body, and it re-enters the realm that we live in. This cycle of birth, death, and rebirth is the reincarnation of the human soul and is known as samsara.

Due to this continuous cycle, Hindus who fully understand the theory of karma and reincarnation are not afraid of death, because it simply means moving from one body to another. Rebirth, just like adolescence and adulthood, is a part of life, and there is no escaping from it. According to Hinduism Today, after each rebirth, the soul becomes more spiritually advanced. Hindus can look forward to a state of being known as moksha, where one has achieved a release from samsara and freedom from rebirth. In this state, the soul has become close to perfect, and it no longer needs a physical body to continue its spiritual advancement. This freedom is the primary goal in life for Hindus. Wealth and power are simply tools that can be utilized to aid others, evolve spiritually, and achieve moksha through the continuous process of rebirth. As explained in the Bhagvad Gita, the concepts of karma and reincarnation are the true essence of life and are as clear as the water that one drinks and as pure as the air that one breathes.
