Weekly Gita Classes are held on Tuesdays and Wednesdays.

Hindu Senior Citizens Club meets twice a month at the Mandir for education, field trips, food, and fellowship.

<u>Yoga Class</u> is held on the 1st Sunday of each month and is open to all.

<u>Community Seva</u>: ITA Seva Samiti provides education and assistance in many areas to our families in need. ITA Seva Samiti has funeral support services, mental health awareness and counseling. We help one life at a time by providing help to individuals or families in our community in times of crisis. We also fundraise for disasters at home and abroad. We raised money for Uttarakhand flood victims and our holy pilgrimage site of Kedarnath, the abode of Lord Shiva. We walk with the American Cancer Society, host funding drives for Be the Match – Bone Marrow Donation and South Asian Marrow Association of Recruiters (SAMAR). We feed the homeless though our sandwich preparation program.

WHY SHOULD I DONATE?

The ITA is a volunteer organization. There are no paid administrative staffers. However, on our payroll, we have two fulltime priests and one part-time priest with full benefits. We keep you informed through our monthly newsletters, and website. We mail yearly Hindu calendars. All of the above events cost significant amounts of money, and the ITA needs your help to continue providing these services to our community.

Each year we seek to provide more opportunities for all age groups to participate in activities designed to promote pride in our Hindu heritage and culture. Your donations help make all of the ITA's work possible.

WHERE DO WE NEED FUNDS?

The ITA is looking for funding for scholarships (\$2,500.00), temple renovations, event-specific donations, festival celebrations, charity, and general maintenance of the organization.

Indian Cultural Center of South Jersey celebrates Grand Opening with 1000+ attendees over 2 days by Ravi D Goel

The Indian Cultural Center of South Jersey (ICC) hosted a 2-day Grand Opening which was one for the ages. The ICC was conceived in the 1980s and faced numerous challenges at early potential locations throughout South Jersey. An ideal 19-acre land parcel on Route 73 in Evesham, NJ was donated to the ICC by Mrs. Kirti and Dr. Prahlad Patel in 2001. Under the leadership of Evesham Mayor Randy Brown and broad support from township, planning board and community leaders, a beautiful \$4.5 million structure and campus was conceived and created which will serve as the home of Indian American cultural events for generations. Mayor Brown led the community in the ribbon cutting ceremony which was instantly shared via video with the ICC's 770+ Facebook supporters worldwide.

The two-day Grand Opening included the unveiling and dedication of "Laxmi Narayan" painting by artist Narendra Amin. Mr. Amin has served the community for more than 40 years by teaching students and donating many paintings and murals to the local Indian Temple Association in Berlin, NJ. His "Gallery of Saints" collection in the local Hindu temple is a testament to philosophers and thinkers across the ages. Many rooms in the ICC have original paintings by Narendra Amin, and the second floor paintings of Indian dancers harken to a Degas-like vision to inspire the young dancers, artists and musicians in the ICC today. Saturday's events included the singing of the American "Star Spangled Banner" and the Republic of India's "Jana Gana Mana." Numerous performances by Drexel Dandiya, Rutgers SAPA fusion, Lavani (Marathi) and Board Street Baadshahz lit up the ICC stage. A dinner for 500+ attendees was followed by a special Bollywood entertainment program by Javid Raza and Saoujanya Madabhushi.

Sunday's program included dance performances by a number of superbly talented dance organizations. Performers brought the spirit of Indian dance and music from across many genres and dialects. A highlight was to watch dancers on stage as other dance troupes watched from the side, a tribute to broad talents and passion. The finale to the weekend was an Indian classical music performance by Nitin Mitta (Tabla), Jay Gandhi (Bansuri) and Amab Chakrabarty (Sarod). Three passionate performers honored every corner of the ICC Grand Ballroom's acoustics and a most inspiring space.
