Gudi Padwa

Date: March 24 in our Mandir from 3: 00PM to 9:00 PM

Gudi Padwa or Gudhi Padwa is the Marathi name for the Hindu holiday of Chaitra Shukla Pratipada. It is celebrated on the first day of the Chaitra month to mark the beginning of the New year. On Gudi Padwa, a gudi is found hanging out of a window or otherwise prominently displayed in traditional Maharashtrian households. Gudi is a bright green or yellow cloth adorned with brocade (zari) tied to the tip of a long bamboo over which gathi (sugar crystals), neem leaves, a twig of mango leaves and a garland of red flowers is tied. A silver or copper pot is placed in the inverted position over it. This gudi is then hoisted outside the house, in a window, terrace or a high place so that everybody can see it.

Mythologically, the Gudhi symbolizes Lord Ram's victory and happiness on returning to Ayodhya after slaying Ravan. Since a symbol of victory is always held high, so is the gudi (flag). It is believed that this festival is celebrated to commemorate the coronation of Ram post his return to Ayodhya after completing 14 years of exile. Maharashtrians also see the Gudhi as a symbol of victory associated with the conquests of the Maratha forces led by Chatrapati Shivaji. Gudhi is believed to ward off evil, invite prosperity and good luck into the house.
