ITA Seva Samiti participation in President Obama's Initiatives with Hindu American Seva Charities:

Energizing Dharmic Seva: Impacting Change in America and Abroad

Nearly 200 Hindu Americans, including ITA Seva Samiti, youth, military and community leaders of many faiths, gathered on July 29 at The White House for the community briefing and the 2nd annual Hindu American Seva Charities (HASC) Conference, "Impacting Change in America and Abroad," an event co-sponsored by the White House Office of Faith-Based and Neighborhood Partnerships.

President Barack Obama supported the effort to strengthen America through community service and sent greetings to all those attending. Joshua DuBois, Special Assistant to the President and Executive Director, Office of Faith-Based and Neighborhood Partnerships and representatives from several federal agencies addressed participants on ways of engaging the faith community. Dubois remarked, "This, Hindu-American gathering, is historic. We hope to bring more understanding of the government support of civic engagement."

With over 80 youth in attendance, an important objective of the conference was to engage youth who want to contribute to their American dream through public service. To promote this effort, HASC had organized an essay contest for participants to write about the role their Hindu faith plays in service and had encouraged participants to provide specific ideas and plans to start a Seva Center in their community. Essay competition applicants and winners were honored with a medal at the White House briefing and were provided opportunities to share their seva plan during the conference. ITA congratulates our Seva Samiti Chair Smt. Lata Pimplaskar for the first winning essay on "How does your Dharma help you in works of Seva". ITA will publish this essay in next edition of Satsang.

ITA Hosts First Bal Vihar Network Conference

On the last day of July 2011, ITA hosted the very first Bal Vihar (Sunday School for children and Youth) Network Conference. The conference was convened to organize, unite and share information among all Bal Vihars across the country and unite them into a mutually supporting network. The conference was organized, planned and moderated by the next generation of born-in-the-USA young Hindus, most of whom had known Shri Dahyabhai for many years.

The following agenda items were thoroughly addressed: (1) Leveraging Strengths/Addressing Weaknesses; (2) Common & Uncommon Issues Facing Bal Vihars; (3) Utilizing Technology to Enhance Our Programs; and (4) Collectively Improving Our Bal Vihars.

It was a huge honor for ITA to host this first-of-a-kind conference and we should be most pleased that all the participants were extremely complimentary about the ITA's support of their conference and willingness to "lend a hand" whenever one was needed. The ITA's Board of Directors – in turn -- wish to express its thanks to Dahyabhai, our temple trustee and past president, and his wife Sushilaben for their incredible work in coordinating and supporting the conference and bringing honor and credit to our temple.

The ITA board also wises to express its compliments and congratulations to the young people who were instrumental in organizing and leading this conference. We believe that the adult Hindu population in the United States would do well to follow our young people's lead in taking a more national and global perspective for our culture. 

Lunch will be served immediately after the ceremony



Second-Place Essays for ITA Scholarship Award What is the moral responsibility of youth in making the world a peaceful place? by Divya Giyanani

A ferocious adversary, he stands resolute in the distance; quietly, he sends a messenger with a foreboding warning, waiting for an opportune moment to strike. Suddenly, the trees, the shrubs, the grasses wither and decay. Suddenly, famine and poverty plague the streets of every city; deprived infants and children and adults cry in anguish for a morsel of food. Suddenly, the world grows corrupted, and the outbreak of war is a common threat. Yet no one responds to the anarchy that abounds. Looming in the distance, he watches, noting the failure of the human race to act. At this rate, he is coming.

The term "peace" has numerous definitions. It can mean "a state of mutual harmony between people or groups or nations" or even a "freedom of the mind from annoyance, distraction, anxiety, obsession, etc". Regardless of an individual's personal definition of peace, it is *our* moral responsibility to make *our* world a peaceful place not only for ourselves, but for future generations as well. Granted, peace cannot be fostered within the course of one night. Likewise, it is difficult to be developed by one individual. However, as Mahatma Gandhi once said, "Be the change you want to see in the world". If we, the future of the world, do not strive for peace, what is the likelihood of a serene, placid future?

The Hindu scriptures preach the concept of tolerance. With the constant threat of war, the severely disturbing global poverty rates, and incalculable hate crimes, society is growing ever more impatient with new perspectives and new ideas. Therefore, it is precisely this message of tolerance, of acceptance that the youth must take to all members of this world, from the laborers in the rice fields to the President of the United States in the Oval Office. But most importantly, that change in disposition must start from within. We live in a society where violence and sorrow and terror persist. We live in a society where resources are utilized without thought for the future, for those after us. We live in a society where peace is a figment of imagination, so far beyond the realm of reality that it oftentimes seems a myth. Some believe it impossible to create a shift in thought towards tolerance; others believe it is not their duty. However, we must remember that this is our society, our community, our world. It is our, and solely our, responsibility to fix it.
