He was able to be with us again on our first session on March 13th, and during that session, we did breathing techniques and practiced meditation. Afterwards, we reviewed a lot about what we learned while Sharad Uncle was gone. Then he talked to us about the universal values, or Dharma. They included Ahimsa (non-injury), Satyam (truthfulness), Asteya (not taking what isn't yours), Nigraha (self restraint), and Shaucham (purity and cleanliness), which are all duties everyone must follow. We learned about these duties at different stages of life. When qualities of life (Gunas) are not followed, they become defects, which is not good. Later, we did some chanting and then did aarti. Lunch was sponsored that day by Nilesh and Sangeeta Doshi.

During the second Youth session on March 27th, we again practiced breathing with Harish uncle, along with Mrs. Babita Kapoor, with whom we practiced meditation. We reviewed Dharma and duties according to classification. We were given a sheet that talked about all of this. While going over this sheet, we specifically talked a lot about Shudra and lethargy. Sharad Uncle then answered any questions we had on any of this material. We chanted the Atharvana Shanti Mantra and another chant related to Dharma. After doing aarti, we had lunch sponsored by Harish and Rekha Shelat. During lunch, Kevin Gandhi, a former Bal Vihar and Youth graduate, came and talked about his visits to India, and how he recommended that we should try to visit India, because that is the best way we can learn more about Indian culture.

Graduation Ceremony at Berlin Mandir

Sunday June 5, 2011 @ 2:00 PM

It is that time of the year when students graduate and reach specific milestones in their lives. The temple plans a celebration for graduates at all levels, starting from the primary school all the way up to colleges and universities, on Sunday June 5, 2011, starting at 2:00 PM at the temple. The festivities will begin with Puja of all deities at the temple, followed by a Yagna-Havan in the parking lot. The festivities will conclude with a prize awarded to each graduate and will be followed by Aarti and Mahaprasad (dinner) by about 5:30 PM.

It is a Hindu tradition to start any celebration with Puja (worship) of God. Each graduate seeks God's blessings for health, wealth, prosperity and happiness as he/she prepares for the next challenge of life. Yagna, more commonly known as Havan on a smaller scale, is a ritual of sacrifice. The Temple has planned to erect a tent in the backyard parking area to perform this ritual to please gods (Devatas), who impart blessings to the graduates. It is said that oblations poured into fire to Agni-Devata (the lord of fire) appeases Devatas, who in return bless the seeker to a successful life.

In a spiritual sense, Yagnas/Havans are performed to enable people to make a sacrifice of all their bad thoughts and actions, as fickleness, hatred, stealing and foolish stubbornness are not considered natural traits of human beings. Yagnas/Havans are physical actions symbolic of inner human quest to get rid of these tendencies and bring about the natural human traits of righteousness and moral/ethical behavior. Yagna is also considered to propel humans to refine their lives by worship of deities, establishing unity (oneness) with god and by helping less privileged in the community through charitable contributions.

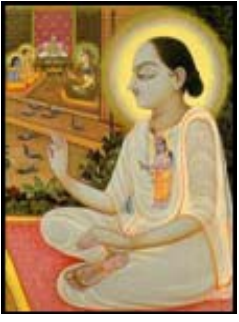

SHRI VALLABHACHARYA (Mahaprabhuji)

(A.D 1479-1531)

Shri Mahaprabhuji, the founder of Pushtimarg, was born in the year 1479 A.D. at Champaranya village near Raipur, Madhya Pradesh. He is considered to be one of the foremost Indian philosophers who expounded the school of Shuddha-advaita. Vallabhacharya heralded a new era of Bhakti-Marga. He propagated unswerving love towards God and brought everyone into the fold, irrespective of sex, caste, or nationality.

Shri Vallabhacharya advocated Pushti Marga, the path of grace, as a way of life that can be easily practiced by an average person. His core message is that, "God takes care of you unconditionally when you commit yourself to God by following the ritual of "Brahma-Sambanth". His teachings, compiled in "Shrodas- Grantha", convey that Bhakti is not a mean to an end, but it is an end unto itself. This, he called Premlakshana Bhakti.

Shri Vallabhacharya's commentaries on the scriptures clarify his principles. These include commentary on Brahma Sutra (Anu-Bhashya), commentary on Shrimad Bhagavata (Subodhini), and tattva Dipa Nibandha. These works are regarded as the most authentic works to seek knowledge of God.

Shri Mahaprabhuji's son Shri Vitthalnathji (also known as shri Gusaiji) embellished "Seva Bhav" by offering worship eight different times of the day to Shrinathji. Ashta Sakha's kirtans were a devotional expression for their personal experience with the Lord. During these times they witnessed the 'Lila' and sang the praises of the Lord. While the text of Shrimad Bhagavata is the ripened fruit of all scriptural knowledge, kirtans of the Ashta Sakha is the refined essence for the experience of the masses.
